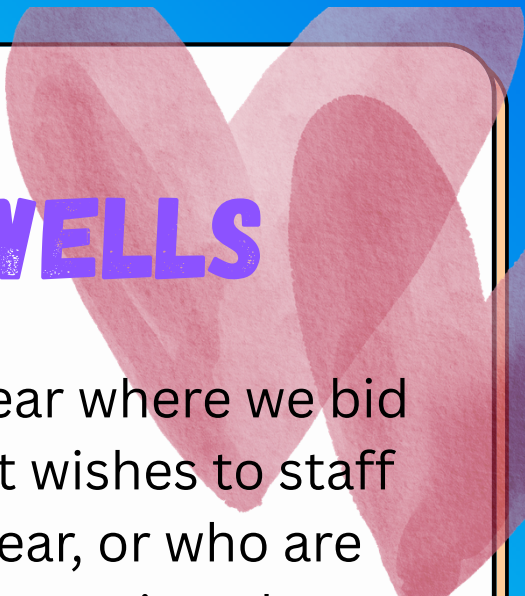

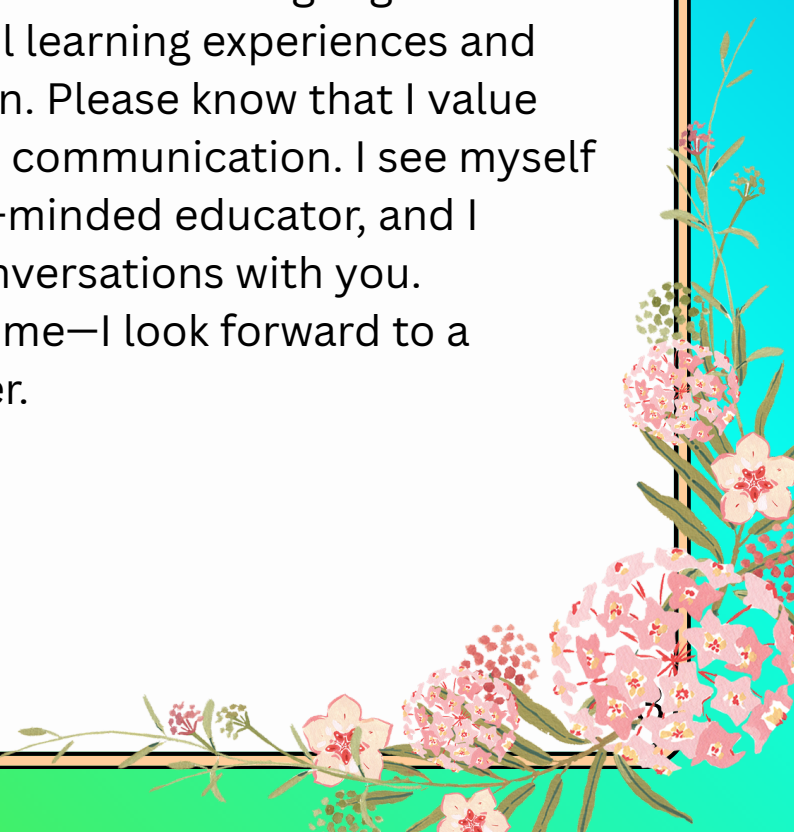

NOTICE OF LATE RETURN TO SCHOOL

A form from the Office is to be completed for any student(s) who expects to return to school LATER THAN 12:00 pm Wednesday, Sep. 9, 2026, AND ON or BEFORE Sep. 11, 2026. Please complete this form and return to the school Principal before June 24, 2026. Please attach a letter that contains an explanation of the extenuating circumstances for returning late in September.

The reason for a late return should only be for extremely extenuating circumstances.

In the event of an unforeseen critical family circumstance occurring on or after June 25, 2026 that causes an unexpected late return to the school, the parent must advise the school as soon as possible by email via the school website or by letter directed to the principal.



A child who does not return to school by September 11, 2026 may lose their placement and may have to attend another school upon their late return.

**Discount Code for
McNeely Families!**

We have a new code available that provides a \$25 discount for a full camp week at our Richmond Camp.

Each time the code is used, this would give the registering family a \$25 discount for a full camp week and your PAC a \$25 donation at the end of the summer for each week registered. If 100 families sign up for one week, that would be a \$2,500 donation to your PAC and \$2,500 in savings to families.

Code: PAC25

The code can be used more than once by each family to register campers for multiple weeks and for multiple siblings.

The code is valid for our 5-day camp weeks (Monday-Friday) as well as our 4-day camp weeks (June 29-July 3 and August 4-7). The code cannot be applied to individual dates scattered over multiple weeks.

The camper must be from your school and register for the Richmond Camp in order for the code to be applied toward the discount for the camper's registration and the donation to your PAC. There is a spot on our registration form where families can write the name of the school their child attends.

When registering, families can include the code in the applicable section on their registration form, which is available on our website.
